MEMBERSHIP OF THE BOARD

The Prairie Provinces Water Board is composed of five members. The three provincial members represent the Provinces of Alberta, Saskatchewan and Manitoba, and the two federal members represent the Department of Agriculture, and the Department of Energy, Mines and Resources. The Engineering Secretary to the Board is employed by the Prairie Farm Rehabilitation Administration (Canada Department of Agriculture). During 1966, the following persons served on the Board:

WARRANT AND FUNCTION OF THE BOARD

The Prairie Provinces Water Board was established on 28 July 1948 by agreement between the Governments of Canada, Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta. A copy of that agreement is attached to the Sixteenth Annual Report as Appendix I.

The Board's function, as expressed in that agreement, is "to recommend the best use to be made of interprovincial waters in relation to associated resources in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta and to recommend the allecation of water as between each such province of streams flowing from one province into another province."

The duties of the Board are set out in detail in the agreement. Briefly they are:-

- (a) to collate and analyze existing data;
- (b) to determine what other data are required from time to time;
- (c) to recommend the allocation of water of any interprovincial stream; and
- (d) to report on any questions relating to projects for the utilization or control of common river or lake systems.

REVIEW OF ACTIVITIES IN 1966

MEETINGS IN 1966

The Board held two meetings in 1966; one in Edmonton on 8 February and one in Winnipeg on 2 June.

ENGINEERING SECRETARY

Mr. C. Booy resigned from his position with PFRA in September in order to take up an appointment with the University of Manitoba. Mr. J. G. S. McMorine of the Hydrology Division, PFRA, has subsequently been acting as Engineering Secretary.

APPOINTMENT OF ALBERTA AND MANITOBA MEMBERS

By Order-in-Council No. 1894/65, Mr. T. E. Weber was appointed alternate representative to act in the absence of Mr. J. A. Griffiths, Member for Manitoba, with effect from 1 January 1966.

By Order-in-Council No. 350/66, Mr. R. E. Bailey was appointed to succeed Mr. F. L. Grindley, as Member for Alberta, with effect from 28 February 1966.

ALBERTA REQUEST FOR ALLOCATION REVISIONS

During 1966, the Chairman and Engineering Secretary endeavoured, by correspondence and discussion with the Members concerned, to arrive at a compromise solution to this problem. Additional discussions between the Alberta and Saskatchewan Members have not been concluded and the matter remains unresolved for the time being.

APPORTIONMENT COMMITTEE

Early in 1966, the Apportionment Committee submitted its report entitled "Apportionment of the Water of Interprovincial Streams between the Provinces of Alberta, Manitoba and Saskatchewan." This report was prepared in accordance with the instructions of the Board given in Minutes 28-09 and 29-12.

After certain revisions had been made, the Board accepted the report as a working paper for further discussions of the apportionment problem.

"AD HOC" COMMITTEE REPORT - DATA NETWORK PLANNING COMMITTEE

The "Ad Hoc" Committee, in accordance with the instructions of the Board contained in Minute 32-11, submitted its report at the February, 1966 meeting of the Board. The Committee had been instructed to "prepare recommendations on procedures and terms of reference" with regard to "long-range planning and interprovincial co-ordination of hydrometrical and meteorological requirements of Joint Interest to the Prairie Provinces." After revision, the Board accepted the report at its meeting of June, 1966.

In accordance with the recommendations of the report, the Board established a "Data Network Planning Committee." The first meeting of this committee was convened by the Engineering Secretary at Winnipeg on 22 August 1966. The report of this meeting will be presented to the Board in due course.

ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON SURFACE WATER DATA REQUIREMENTS

Early in 1966, the Chairman advised the Deputy Minister, Canada Department of Northern Affairs and National Resources, of the interest of the Board in the committee established by his Department. Members of the Board have duly accepted the invitation to appoint representatives to this committee.

POLLUTION COMMUTTEE

At the September, 1965, meeting of the Board, Minute 32-10, the committee was instructed to prepare an interim report outlining the situation at that time. The committee presented this interim report at the June, 1966, meeting of the Board. It is hoped, in the light of Members' written comments to the Chairman of the committee, to prepare a final report more in accordance with the instructions of the Board given at its meeting of March, 1964. Minute 27-07.

QU'APPELLE ASSINIBOINE STUDY

This study was completed during 1966, and a report and appendix have been presented to the Board.

OTHER REPORTS AND STUDIES

- 1. At the February, 1966, meeting of the Board, the Engineering Secretary was instructed to update PPWB Report No. 1 entitled "Recorded and Natural Monthly Flows at certain points on the Sackstchewan River System." This assignment has been completed and presented as PPWB Report No. 1A entitled "Summary Report of Natural Yearly Flows at certain points on the Saskatchewan River System, by Calendar Year, for the Period 1912-1963 inclusive."
- 2. Completion of a report by Dr. Laycock on "Water Surplus and Deficiency Patterns in the Prairie Provinces" is anticipated early in 1967.


- 3. An estimate of streamflow depletions for the Saskatchewan River System is kept current by the Engineering Secretariat. A chart on the following page provides a graphical comparison between these depletions and the recorded flows at Saskatoon and The Pas.
- 4. A tabulation of "Acreage Actually Irrigated" in the Alberta portion of the South Saskatchewan Basin has been prepared and may be found immediately following the flows and depletions graph. The tabulation is based primarily on material supplied by the Alberta Water Resources Branch.


